The Way We Find and Disseminate Information has Changed










Our Understanding of How Learners Learn Best Has Changed





 Longitudinal assignment to a care delivery site


Goals:

Students Adding Value while Learning: Examples of Projects


- Preoperative conditioning of geriatric patients






