Course Title: "The Care of Vulnerable Patients: Partnering to Achieve Health Equity"

Course Description

Medical research over the last two decades has clearly documented that people of lower socioeconomic status and from minority racial and ethnic backgrounds have worse health and often receive a lower standard of health care. These worse health outcomes are attributed to inequity in distribution of resources and to the way that medicine is practiced. Initially termed disparities in health and healthcare, the poorer health and inferior healthcare received by the underprivileged are now pointedly referred to as inequities in health and health care. With this perspective, a person and a community's health and the healthcare they receive are measures of social justice.

The medical research suggesting that healthcare workers and the healthcare system contribute to inequities in health for vulnerable patients demands that medical education be recast to assure that medical care itself does not perpetuate societal injustices. Medical education must prepare health care workers to care for people who are poor, chronically ill, elderly, addicted, mentally ill, victims of violence, or from minority or disadvantaged backgrounds. Our course reframes traditional medical teaching integrating medical research and a social justice perspective to tackle some of the issues that complicate the care of underserved patients.
